Sustainable Development is considered to be the 'backbone' of the regeneration of Britain's communities.

The **Energy in Regeneration Conference** will address the important energy efficiency and low & zero carbon energy generation opportunities provided by urban and rural regeneration.

The conference is intended for all who have strategic responsibilities for regeneration and/or the delivery of sustainable energy programmes.

In the year that all of Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly's local authorities have been awarded Beacon Council Status for Sustainable Energy it is particularly relevant that this event is taking place in the new university campus near Falmouth. The workshop sessions have been specifically designed to assist decision-making at a time when regions such as Cornwall prepare for future EU and national funds.

The speakers and session leaders are key players involved at European, national, regional and local level in the delivery, promotion and monitoring of sustainability.

CSEP's conference dinners are always enjoyable affairs. This year places at the dinner are a bargain at £25 as the pre-dinner speaker is the Arctic Explorer Pen Hadow.
